
We perceive in-group heterogeneity but out-group homogeneity

3) Disciplinary & Cultural Differences

- Methodological: Tendency to assume disciplinary methodology is the best approach

- Professional: Presentation, publication, knowledge translation outlets
- Cultural: Attitudes, practices, etc.
